## Pomp and Circumstance Revisited



Dear AeroStar Family and Friends,

The 2020-2021 school year has been a year like none other. In this special issue of AeroStar News, we will celebrate the heroic efforts of AeroStar students who continued to learn despite the social, emotional, and academic challenges they faced in transitioning from in-person classroom learning to online. Not only did our students achieve lift-off from the very beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, thanks in part to the AeroVerse E-Learning Academy, they maintained a high altitude of determination and success throughout the year. We are proud of them!

Ironically, as the school year is ending, schools are now returning to in-person learning. If Covid cases continue to fall during the summer months, students will return to a more “normal,” traditional classroom in August and September.

But what about our graduates? How will the past year impact their future educational and career plans? Without a doubt, they will not see a return to normal for some time to come. And when it comes to paying for education, that may not be a bad thing.

### **The High Cost of Post-Secondary Education**

In 2020, student loan debt totaled a record \$1.6 trillion ([Forbes](#)), increasing more than 100% in 10 years ([CNBC](#)). Some 43.2 million student borrowers are in debt by an average of \$39,351 each ([educationdata.org](#)).

African American students have been hit the hardest. Educationdata.org presents the following dismal statistics (see [here](#) and [here](#)):

- Black college students are the most likely to use federal loans, with 49.4% borrowing.
- 30% of Black college graduates with student loans default in the first 12 years of repayment.
- Four years after graduation, 48% of Black students owe an average of 12.5% more than they borrowed.
- Black student borrowers are the most likely to struggle financially due to student loan debt, with 29% making monthly payments of \$350 or more.
- Black college graduates owe an average of \$25,000 more in student loan debt than

White college graduates.

Clearly, African Americans suffer the most, but regardless of a student's race – or gender for that matter – this economic state of affairs is not sustainable. How did we get here? Four-year colleges and universities have a monopoly on post-secondary education, and from middle school to high school, students are aggressively guided into this single educational pathway.

### **Exciting Options in Aviation Training**

For students seeking careers in aviation, however, there are more cost and time efficient training pathways. According to Boeing's Pilot and Technician Outlook: 2020-2039:

"Amid challenges posed by COVID-19, the training industry has begun to adopt increasingly innovative solutions. Many providers have transitioned their offerings to online and virtual formats where possible, allowing students to continue their learning safely. Immersive technologies, adaptive learning and flexible distance learning methods are also being explored to enable optimum learning and knowledge retention. Investments in technology that are being made today will likely lead to a long-term fundamental shift in how training is conducted." ([Source](#))

At AeroStar, we help students pursue a variety of training pathways, including two-year colleges, trade schools, flight schools, and the military. For example, in this issue you'll read about our work with the Gary Area Career Center where, thanks to a generous grant from The Boeing Company, students enjoy a direct training path to well-paying aviation jobs.

Our students are well equipped to succeed in these rigorous programs, and they matriculate without taking on enormous debt loads. Once they've landed the job of their dreams, they can continue to learn at a four-year university if they so desire. As a bonus, many companies in the industry offer tuition reimbursement. Win win!






the four forces of flight and how a plane lands.

Career days provide an excellent hands-on opportunity to expose students to the many careers available in the aviation industry. A child is never too young to learn about aviation!




## Field Trips: AeroStar Students Explore the World of Aviation Onsite

## AR, VR to Enhance Learning for AeroStar Students



AeroStar is collaborating with ARSOME Technology Group, LLC, to design enhanced content that provides memorable experiences for students. AeroStar's proprietary five-module curriculum will be enhanced with ARSOME's Augmented Reality (AR) or Virtual Reality (VR) technology. Each module will be designed for three

student levels: elementary, middle, and high school.

As students interact with “real” world objects in VR and immerse themselves in AR worlds, we expect that engagement, comprehension, and retention will be heightened, and that at least 70% of students will complete the modules. Best practices to ensure student safety will be implemented.

Not only will AR/VR-enhanced modules provide a “wow” factor for learning, the technology will increase knowledge retention, build technical skills, bolster STEM confidence, and enable measurement of learning outcomes.



## AeroStar Instructors Attend Professional Development Retreat



AeroStar held an online retreat for instructors on April 23, 2021. We debriefed the Fall and Spring terms, and discussed best practices in instructor performance, areas of improvement, and goals for the Summer session. 100 years after Bessie Coleman received her private pilots license in France, because no flight school in America would take a colored girl, African-American female's make up less than 1/2 of 1% (0.5%) of airline pilots flying today. African Americans overall make up less that 5% of the Aviation industry. This is

not due to lack of interest or skill, but can be directly attributed to discriminatory practices that have eliminated access and created barriers to entry for millions of black and brown people over generations. AeroStar's Aerospace Talent Pipeline Project in partnership with The Boeing Company, United Airlines, Milhouse Charities, and many more, is changing the narrative.
