Overcoming Obstacles to Inspire and Fly

Senator Tammy Duckworth

Tammy Duckworth was born in Bangkok, Thailand before moving to Hawaii when she was 16. She joined the National Guard as a helicopter pilot, was called to active duty, and lost her legs in combat. She received a Purple Heart on her return and jumped into the political sphere without hesitation. There was work to be done. Her political career has included the House of Representatives, Assistant Secretary of Veterans Affairs, and now, the U.S. Senate. She is an advocate for veterans, new mothers, and working-class families. Being wheelchair has not changed her fight, only strengthened it. Duckworth's perseverance shines in her political achievements, completion of four marathons, and advocacy for diverse groups of people.

Marcellus Freeman is a Second-In-Command pilot for a Hawker 900XP.







He struggled through this program with grit and determination. Any failure or misstep only made him more determined to persevere. He has been in mentoring with AeroStar for the past years. On top of this, his 10 technological STEM background provided him with ample opportunities to reach his goals.

Nia Gilliam-Wordlaw

Nia Gilliam-Wordlaw is a United Airlines pilot and co-founder of "Sisters of the Skies," an organization to mentor and inspire young women of color with a passion for aviation. She is fighting against the cost and obstacles women of color experience in becoming pilots. Despite the current composition, her fight demands more diversity in aviation.

The Aviation Instructor for the Gary Area Career Center will be the primary instructor for students to receive FAA certified level training provided they successfully complete the program. The instructor accomplishes this by providing students with a program of study that teaches required program skills, develops employability skills, and reinforces academic skills through the use of rigorous curricula. The Instructor will also handle all responsibilities associated with the High Tech Flight Simulator Laboratory, including program coordination, school-wide integration/collaboration, and special events/workshops/classes. - Have logged at least 250 hours of flight time.

- Bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university AND 2,000+ hours of department-approved, aviation-related work experience, OR; No degree and 8,000 hours of department-approved, aviation-related work experience
- Complete Work-based learning Instructor requirements as directed by Indiana
